OUR FOCUS IS ON YOU..... Bill Webster, Membership Chairman



Bill was born and raised in Oklahoma City. He quit school in November 1947 at age 15 and joined the Navy to see the world, which he thought was for three years. When the Korean War started in June 1950, Uncle Sam decided they needed one more year of his life.

Bill served his duty, on the USS Sperry AS-12, shore duty at the Destroyer Base in San Diego California and aboard the USS Tabberer DE-418. He was discharged in October 1951.

In January 1952 Bill enrolled in Central High in OKC and attended school a half day and worked half day. He started working for Robberson Steel Company in the shop in the summer of 1952. When school started in the fall, Bill began working in the office as a messenger/office boy and continued in that department until he graduated in May 1954. During this time, he met and married his lovely Wife Glenda and they were married in December 1953. They raised two fine sons, Glen & Steve. Bill did all the Daddy things, Cub Master, coached little league Baseball & Football. Bill is now doing all the Granddad things for three wonder grandchildren, Holly 16, Lindsey 9, and Blake 4.

Bill was employed at Robberson Steel for 25 years, the last several years in Contract Sales, until 1977, continuing his sales career with W&W Steel Company until his retirement in March 1997.

In 1978 Bill & Glenda started a small business, buying and selling used photography equipment. In 1984, they had a photography garage sale. That was their first meeting with Joe Wilson. He invited them to attend a Metro Camera Club meeting, and Bill joined shortly afterwards. Bill said he has enjoyed the association with all of the members though the years, and what few skills I have as a photographer are due to being a member of Metro Camera Club. Bill has served as Treasurer, Vice President, Membership Chairman and President.

Glenda and Bill volunteer at the International Photography Hall of Fame, where Bill serves on the local Board of Directors.

So there, now you know more about our affable, amiable Membership Chairman. who has been an active contributing participant in Club work since joining Metro in 1984.
