



# **New Contest-Digital Treasure Hunt 2009: Rules of Competition**



- **4 photographs in 3 categories (Halloween-Kitchen Utensils-Nuts and Bolts)**
  - **The four photographs from one category do not have to be taken together, a photograph for Category A can be followed by one for B, etc.**
- **Categories announced @ October 26th meeting**
- **Photographs must be shot in jpg format and saved directly to portable digital storage media (cards; don't save them directly to the camera memory.)**
- **Photographs to be brought to the November 9<sup>th</sup> meeting on portable digital storage media.**
- **The 12 entries must have been taken sequentially on the same storage media, NO DO-OVERS (all twelve photographs must be consecutively numbered.)**
  - **Entries with non-sequential numbers on the digital media disqualifies the entire submission. The card you use for the contest will have to be dedicated to the contest until the photographs are submitted. Don't make photographs for other purposes on the same card.**
  - **Submissions that are deemed to have been taken non-sequentially by other means, likewise, will be disqualified.**
- **Contestants must pre-enter at the October 26<sup>th</sup> meeting so that the chair and his elf(ves) can prepare for acceptance of the images.**
- **Entries will be downloaded and the portable digital storage media returned to the member that evening.**
- **Entries will be judged by a jury of someone's peers according to the same criteria as for the conventional Treasure Hunt competition, ie., creativity, proper exposure, representation of the category, composition, etc.**

## **CAMERON AWARD REQUIREMENTS**

The Charles Cameron Award has been created by the Metro Camera Club to honor the memory of one of our most distinguished members, Dr Charles Cameron who was an outstanding member of our club from 1988 to his death in 1998.

### ***ELIGIBILITY***

A member of the Metro Camera Club in good standing for a minimum of five years may receive this award.

### ***NOMINATIONS***

A member in good standing may present one nomination for consideration of the award in writing to the current club president. The time to submit the nomination will be announced at a regular club meeting prior to the presentation of the award at the club Christmas party.

### ***PURPOSE***

The award will be presented to a club member whose activities demonstrate unselfish and outstanding work, which promotes the activities and goals of the Metro Camera Club. The award may be given only once to a member.

### ***SELECTION***

The award recipient will be selected by the club's executive board in executive session. Their choice will be final. The award need not be made when in the

judgment of a majority of the executive board that there is not a deserving nominee. Presentation of the award may be made posthumously.

# VETERANS DAY, NOVEMBER 11



An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

Later that same year, on October 8th, President Dwight D. Eisenhower issued the [first "Veterans Day Proclamation"](#) which stated: "In order to insure proper and widespread observance of this anniversary, all veterans, all veterans' organizations, and the entire citizenry will wish to join hands in the common purpose. Toward this end, I am designating the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs as Chairman of a Veterans Day National Committee, which shall include such other persons as the Chairman may select, and which will coordinate at the national level necessary planning for the observance. I am also requesting the heads of all departments and agencies of the Executive branch of the Government to assist the National Committee in every way possible."

On that same day, the President Eisenhower sent [a letter to the Honorable Harvey V. Higley, Administrator of Veterans' Affairs \(VA\)](#), designating him as Chairman of the Veterans Day National Committee. In 1958, the White House advised VA's General Counsel that the 1954 designation of the VA Administrator as Chairman of the Veterans Day National Committee applied to all subsequent VA Administrators. Since March 1989 when VA was elevated to a cabinet level department, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs has served as the committee's chairman.

The Uniform Holiday Bill (Public Law 90-363 (82 Stat. 250)) was signed on June 28, 1968, and was intended to ensure three-day weekends for Federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day, and Columbus Day. It was thought that these extended weekends would encourage travel, recreational and cultural activities and stimulate greater industrial and commercial production. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holidays on their original dates.

The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on October 25, 1971. It was quite apparent that the commemoration of this day was a matter of historic and patriotic significance to a great number of our citizens, and so on September 20th, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed Public Law 94-97 (89 Stat. 479), which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of November 11, beginning in 1978. This action supported the desires of the overwhelming majority of state legislatures, all major veterans service organizations and the American people.

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.
