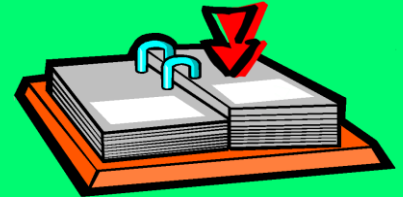

Christmas Dinner – December 8, 2014

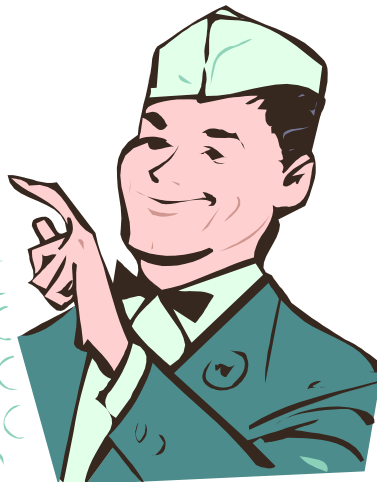
Time: 6:30 PM (Note: This is earlier than normal meetings)

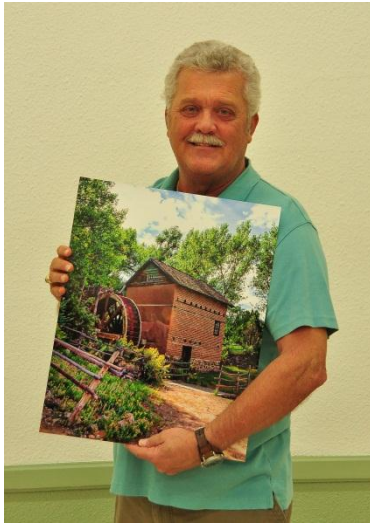

Competition Announcements – Last PDI Entries

There is one more competition night left – PDI competition. This competition is on the 1st Meeting of the Month instead of the second. Make sure you have your minimum photos (12) in to be qualified for the end of the year competition. Check with Janet Steyer (blumencards@sbcglobal.net) or look on the website at <http://metrocameraclub.org/compete.html> and click on the PDI Statistics links on the left hand side of the screen to check how many photos you have entered for the year. If you haven't gotten in your 12 photos make sure to get those in at the next competition.



Metro Camera Club Exhibit at the Myriad Gardens

The Metro Camera is organizing a juried exhibit which will be hung at the Myriad Gardens from March 5, 2015 through April 3, 2015. Forty images will be selected for the show. Some images will be chosen and kept in reserve in the event that some of the original photographers selected drop out.

All Metro Camera Club members are eligible to enter up to 5 images for the exhibit. We will strive to include everyone who enters but we are limited in the number of photographs we can hang and the images will be juried, so please enter only your best work. In order to reach our goal of 40 photographs, some members may have more than 1 image selected.

Members may enter 11x14 images or 16x20 images. All photographs selected for the exhibit will be printed at Bedford's lab on a polished aluminum plate. There is no entry fee, however, if your entry is selected, there will be a charge for the metal prints. An 11x14 metal print will cost approximately \$36 and a 16x20 metal print will cost approximately \$64. All photographs in the exhibit will be for sale unless the photographer specifies otherwise. A base price will be set at \$150 for 11x14 and \$225 for 16x20. The photographer may increase the price if he or she wishes. The Myriad Gardens will retain a 30% commission on all sales, remit the sales tax to the Oklahoma Tax Commission, and write one check to the Metro Camera Club for net sales. The Metro Camera Club will then write checks to the members that have sold their photographs.

There is no theme for the exhibit. Any appropriate subject is welcome; however, keep in mind that floral themes, local scenes, and Oklahoma subjects might do well for selling purposes. Color and black/white images, either vertical or horizontal are acceptable.

ENTRIES WILL BE SUBMITTED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Members will send entries to blumencards@sbcglobal.net
2. The email message should include:
 - a. Title of photograph
 - b. Photographer's name
 - c. Specify Color or B&W print
 - d. Selling price—one of the following: NFS—base price—higher price (specify)
 - e. Email address & phone number in the event we need to contact you
3. Attached entry files should be in a jpg format.
4. Resolution of the files should be set at 300 dpi.
5. Dimensions of the files should be the size you want to enter, either 11x14 or 16x20.
6. Rename your jpg file with TITLE, YOUR NAME—Example—MY GREAT FLOWER, JANET STEYER
7. Please, no watermarks (copyright symbols or names) should be embedded in the file.
8. Entries must be received by November 14, 2014 at 9 pm.

Members will be notified of acceptance after November 17, 2014.

If selected, the members are expected to promptly remit cost of the metal print/prints so the committee can get the printing done in a timely manner. Deadline for payment is December 8, 2014 (Christmas Party/Awards Ceremony). Any alternates will be selected & notified after Dec. 8th 2014 if any members fail to meet the deadline. Membership Dues for 2015
